Call For Student Posters and Call for Professional Posters

The Naval Postgraduate School will host the 2024 Maritime Risk Symposium, June 11-13, 2024. This is an annual event where professionals from industry, government, and academia discuss risks to the Maritime Transportation System.

The Maritime Risk Symposium Directors invite graduate and undergraduate students to participate in this year's Maritime Risk Symposium Student Research Poster Competition.

Posters will depict research done by the student or students with the guidance of a faculty advisor. The research could include field work, interviews, literature reviews, emerging technology, or other methods of examining risk factors in the maritime domain.

Poster Research, in general, identifies a gap or problem area, evaluates possible solutions or way ahead, then outlines future actions, policy steps, or research needed for continued advancement. Major panel topics for this year's Maritime Risk Symposium (MRS) are:

- 1. Past Present Future of Multi-Service Maritime Strategy**
- 2. Maritime Domain Awareness and Tri-Service Collaboration**
- 3. Maritime Policy vis a vis the National Maritime Policy**
- 4. Maritime Cyber and Multi-Stakeholder Collaboration**
- 5. Understanding Maritime Risk amidst Gray Zone Conflict**
- 6. Multi-Service and Maritime Industry Collaboration in the Arctic**

While we invite applicants to submit research presentations specific to these tracks, we encourage creativity and will consider all applications that address maritime risk topics. As MRS2024 is not an online event, poster authors are encouraged (but not required) to attend in person.

In addition, we welcome professional posters from non-students to be shared and published, not part of the competition but for offered for informational purposes.

There is no master slide. Students may develop their own slide lay-out but, must have their name and school only.

May 23rd, 2024: Submit an abstract or Poster Title to indicate intent to participate

June 3rd, 2024: Final posters emailed to Rick@RickPaxton.com

June 11th, 2024: MRS begins. Poster presentations, virtual and live, are tentatively scheduled for 4:00 – 7:00 p.m. on the Tuesday June 11th.
